*\*\*\*Students are required to earn credits through participating in ensembles appropriate to their specialties. Instrumental and voice and keyboard majors will be required to participate in two ensembles, large or small. Additional credits for participation in ensembles can be used as elective credit. Large ensembles include: symphony band, wind ensemble, symphony orchestra, concert choir and guitar ensemble. Small ensembles include: Madrigal Singers, Collegium Musicum, opera workshop, jazz choir, jazz orchestra, and brass, percussion, guitar, string, woodwind, or piano ensemble.*

*PLEASE NOTE: All Bachelor of Music in Music majors are required to enroll in and pass MUSC 311+, the zero credit Recital Attendance class, for a total of six semesters in order to be eligible for graduation. Also, students must earn Usher Credit by ushering at a total of six approved events to be eligible for graduation. Refer to the MUSC 311+ syllabus and the Music Student Handbook for complete information.*

*Requirements for graduation include a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.00 overall and in the major, a grade of C or better in all courses required for the major, including prerequisite courses, 120 credit hours, which must include both a minimum of 30 credit hours overall and 12 credit hours in upper-level courses in the major program from Old Dominion University, completion of ENGL 110C, ENGL 211C or 221C or 231C, and a writing intensive (W) course in the major with a grade of C or better, and completion of Senior Assessment.*

*NOTE: Transfer students are encouraged to use their summer semesters to ensure graduation in four years.*
