The accelerated programs provide unique opportunities for students to be involved in industrial, governmental, and academic research projects. Old Dominion University's geographical proximity to such enterprises as the NASA Langley Research Center, the Northrop Grumman Shipyard, the Thomas Jefferson National Laboratory, the Defense Department's Joint Training Analysis and Simulation Center, and Norfolk's unique position as host to the largest Naval Base in the world provides excellent opportunities for students in these programs to be involved in practical engineering and applied research projects, while simultaneously pursuing their academic degrees.

Full-time students can complete the requirements for the bachelor's degree in four years and the master's degree in one additional year.

Linked Programs

Designed to allow qualified students to secure a space in a graduate program available in the Frank Batten Collee of Engineering and Technology while they pursue their graduate degrees in mechanical engineering.

Students are able to count up to **six credit hours** of course work towards both the undergraduate and the graduate degree. These six hours are completed during an undergraduate's senior year.



Highly qualified students are encouraged to pursue accelerated programs because increased education in the engineering fields is rewarded with higher career earnings.

BS/MS BS/ME

Students can choose to pursue a master's of science (M.S.) or a master's of engineering (M.E) in either mechanical or aerospace engineering.

GPA

Students are required to have an overall GPA of a **3.0** or greater.

Students are required to have a major GPA **3.0** or greater.

Class Standing

Students can apply to be admitted to the BS/MS program during their junior or senior year.

Senior Year

Students admitted to the program will take two senior elective courses at the 500 level. These courses will **double count** towards the students senior electives and the master's requirements.

M.E. Program- requires students to complete a three credit project or a final exam M.S. program- requires students to complete a six credit thesis

Example:

An undergraduate student admitted to the BS/MS program still has two senior elective courses to complete during their senior year. They have decided they are interested in the material taught in MAE 440 and MAE 441.

- Instead of taking MAE 440 the students will take MAE 540. The course will be double counted towards the undergraduate and graduate degree.
- Instead of taking MAE 441 the student will register for MAE 541. The course will be double counted.

The students will complete the "Undergraduate Request to take Graduate Level Courses" form
