- First part of policy will be the scope
 - The scope will reference the specific language provided by the AAUP
 - The AAUP standards allow faculty to speak as citizens in "the public sphere" either as experts in our areas or as citizens
 - The university should provide the same protections to faculty in the public sphere as it does in the professional sphere consistent with First Amendment Law
 - There is no intent to limit coverage to tenure only
 - 2014 Chicago Statement of Principles for rights in education
 - This is a dynamic statement that lends further strength to support of faculty protections
 - Add language to cover clinical practitioners
 - Revise language to consider smaller interactions with students outside of classroom or laboratory settings
 - Please reference the Faculty Handbook ethics section for more specific language
