
The Office of Faculty Diversity and Retention hopes you will have an inspiring and productive Spring semester.

WORKSHOPS

On June 27, 2023, the director of the Office of Faculty Diversity and Retention, Dr. Shanda Jenkins, presented a workshop entitled, "By the Numbers". This workshop discussed the current data on faculty diversity, retention, and tenure at Old Dominion University. The By the Numbers workshop developed into another discussion analyzing the ODU data in comparison to mutual peer institutions. On September 21, 2023, the Faculty Diversity & Retention Data workshop reviewed and discussed this data.
