- 1. ENGL 110C and 211C (ENG 111 and 112) are required for the BS in Criminal Justice at ODU. If AAS only requires ENG 111, student will have to take ENGL 211C at ODU.
- 2. Please consult with your VCCS advisor to select the required course (s) for the AAS, but that will also fulfill ODU's required Lower-Division General Education course(s). Choose courses from ODU's VCCS Transfer Guide <a href="http://www.odu.edu/transfer/vccs-transfer-quide.html">http://www.odu.edu/transfer/vccs-transfer-quide.html</a> in any of the following categories: Philosophy and Ethics, Interpreting the Past (History), Human Creativity, Literature, or Foreign Language.
- 3. STAT 130M (MTH 155 or 245) is required for the BS degree at ODU. It is highly recommended to already have taken the math requirement at the VCCS. However, if a student transfers without STAT 130M they will have to take it at ODU.
- 4. Take all courses required to complete the AAS degree at VCCS. CRJS 262 plus CRJS 2ELE (6 credits) will be awarded at ODU for Police Academy training if applicable. Please consult ODU advisor.
- 5. Students may have to complete additional General Education courses at ODU, to meet the required guidelines for the Lower-Division General Education (LDGE) waiver: <a href="https://www.odu.edu/sites/default/files/documents/guidelines-vccs-associate-meet-lowdiv-gened-req.pdf">https://www.odu.edu/sites/default/files/documents/guidelines-vccs-associate-meet-lowdiv-gened-req.pdf</a>
- 6. PSYC 201S, SOC 201S, and an additional Human Behavior (Social Science) course are required for the BS in CRJS at ODU. Some AAS degrees require these courses as well, but if not, students must take the missing course(s) at ODU.
- 7. Consult with ODU advisor for the remaining required courses to complete the BS in Criminal Justice at ODU.

### Notes (continued):

Lower-Division General Education waiver and course substitutions are not automatic upon enrollment to ODU, students must notify academic advisor for these to be processed upon verification.
