The facts regarding Interpersonal Violence:

- 1 in 5 women has been sexually assaulted while in college.
- Rape is the most common and underreported violent crime on college campuses.
- 1 in 10 men experience unwanted sexual contact.
- More than 80% of all rapes are non-stranger rapes; on college campuses, it is more than 90%.
- Women are at greatest risk for sexual assault during their first 6 weeks on campus.
- Women aged 16 to 24 experience the highest per capita rate of intimate partner violence.
- 1 in 6 women and 1 in 19 men experience stalking.
